Appointment at Immigration office: You must have an appointment to go to the U.S. Immigration office downtown. You can make an appointment at this website: www.infopass.uscis.gov. Instructions are written in English, Spanish, Russian, Arabic, Vietnamese, French, Chinese, Creole, Tagalog, Korean, Polish, and Portuguese. Public libraries have computers you can use for free, or you can ask a friend to help you.

Passports for U.S. citizens:

To get a U.S. passport for the first time, citizens must apply in person at certain U.S. Post Offices. Passports may be renewed on-line at www.travel.state.gov. U.S. passport information: 1-877-487-2778.
